## The Gathering Hymn

Please join in with the words in **Bold** type We stand when the bell rings and the ministers enter.

Priest Alleluia! Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Priest The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Priest Let us proceed in peace. Alleluia!

In the name of Christ. Alleluia!

The procession stops at the Easter Garden and the priest asks for God's blessing upon it. The procession continues around the church and into the sanctuary.

Jesus Christ is risen to-day, Alleluya! Our triumphant holy day, Alleluya! Who did once, upon the Cross, Alleluya! Suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluya!

Hymns of praise then let us sing, Alleluya! Unto Christ, our heavenly King, Alleluya! Who endured the Cross and grave, Alleluya! Sinners to redeem and save. Alleluya!

But the pains that he endured Alleluya! Our salvation have procured; Alleluya! Now above the sky he's King, Alleluya! Where the angels ever sing. Alleluya!

Alleluia, alleluia, give thanks to the risen Lord, alleluia, alleluia, give praise to his name.

Jesus is Lord of all the earth.

He is the king of creation. *Alleluia...* 

Spread the good news o'er all the earth. Jesus has died and has risen. Alleluia...

We have been crucified with Christ.

Now we shall live for ever. Alleluia...

God has proclaimed the just reward: 'Life for us all, alleluia!' Alleluia...

Come let us praise the living God, joyfully sing to our Saviour. Alleluia...

Priest Let us praise God's glory!

Glory be to God in heaven, peace to those who love him well; on the earth let all his people speak his grace, his wonders tell: Lord, we praise you for your glory, mighty Father, heaven's king; hear our joyful adoration and accept the thanks we bring.

Only Son of God the Father, Lamb who takes our sin away, now with him in triumph seated for your mercy, Lord, we pray: Jesus Christ, most high and holy, Saviour, you are God alone in the glory of the Father with the Spirit: Three-in-One!

The Collect, the special prayer for the day, is prayed, and we respond: **Amen**.

## The Bible Readings

The First Reading: Acts 10.34-43

Reader This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

As the procession moves to the centre of the church, please stand and turn to face the Gospel Book.

Priest The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

Priest Hear the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ according to John

All Glory to you, O Lord.

John 20.1-18 is read.

After the Gospel:

Priest This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All Praise to you, O Christ.

**Homily** 

The preacher shares a word about the Gospel reading.

### **Renewal of Baptismal Vows**

All the baptised who are present renew their vows. The priest says:

Priest As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from

the dead, we remember that through the Paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism. To follow Christ

means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Priest Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

All I reject them.

Priest Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

All I renounce them.

Priest Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God

and neighbour?

All I repent of them.

Priest Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

All I turn to Christ.

Priest Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

All I submit to Christ.

Priest Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

All I come to Christ.

We move to the font. Please do gather round.

Priest Brothers and sister, I ask you to profess the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Priest Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

All I believe In Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the Virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died and was buried;

he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Priest Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

All I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the Holy catholic Church, the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Priest Almighty God,

we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all who have been baptized in your name.

Keep us faithful to our baptism,

and so make us ready for that day

when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son,

our Saviour Jesus Christ.

All Amen.

The altar party returns to the sanctuary

The Prayers

We kneel or sit for the Intercessions. The prayers finish with the following,

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Peace

The priest introduces the Peace.

Priest Alleluia. The peace of the risen Christ be always with you

All And also with you. Alleluia.

We share a sign of peace: a handshake and the words 'Peace be with you'.

During the next hymn bread and wine are prepared on the altar and a collection is taken.

The day of resurrection!
Earth, tell it out abroad;
the Passover of gladness,
the Passover of God.
From death to life eternal,
from earth unto the sky,
our Christ hath brought us over,
with hymns of victory.

The round world keep high triumph, and all that is therein!
Let all things seen and unseen their notes in gladness blend, for Christ the Lord hath risen, our joy that hath no end.

# The Prayer of Thanksgiving

Priest The Lord be with you and also with you.

Priest Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest praises God for sending Jesus, with a prayer which concludes:

Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Great is the mystery of faith. Priest

ΔII Christ has died. Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

The priest prays the prayer of consecration ('making holy' the bread and wine), finishing with the Lord's Prayer

AΙΙ Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come; thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory,

for ever and ever.

Amen.

She breaks the bread, saying

We break this bread Priest

to share in the body of Christ.

All Though we are many, we are one body,

because we all share in one bread.

All Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.

> Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us peace.

Priest Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us. ΔII Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

If you normally receive **Holy Communion** in your own church, you are welcome to do so here. If you do not wish to receive, please come forward for a blessing. Please join with the following song during communion.

Now the green blade riseth from the buried grain, Wheat that in the dark earth many years has lain; Love lives again, that with the dead has been: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.

In the grave they laid Him, Love whom men had slain, Thinking that never he would wake again Laid in the earth like grain that sleeps unseen: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.

Forth he came at Easter, like the risen grain, EP He that for three days in the grave had lain; Quick from the dead my risen Lord is seen: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.

When our hearts are wintry, grieving or in pain, Thy touch can call us back to life again; Fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been: Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.

After communion a prayer of thanksgiving is offered.

The Dismissal

We stand for the blessing

Priest The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

The priest gives God's blessing, to which we respond: **Amen.** 

Priest With the risen life of Christ within you,

go in the peace of Christ. Alleluia. Alleluia.

All Thanks be to God. Alleluia. Alleluia.

The altar party assembles in front of the altar. We unite ourselves with the joy of Jesus' Mother on this day of resurrection.

Joy to thee O Queen of heaven, alleluia! He who thou wast meet to bear, alleluia! As he promised, has arisen, alleluia! Pour for us to God thy prayer, alleluia!

Priest Rejoice and be glad O Virgin Mary, alleluia!

All For the Lord is risen indeed, alleluia!

The priest sings the collect, to which we respond: **Amen.** 

Please remain standing for the final hymn as the altar party leaves.

Thine be the glory, risen, conquering Son; endless is the victory, thou o'er death hast won; angels in bright raiment rolled the stone away, kept the folded grave clothes where thy body lay.

#### Chorus

Thine be the glory, risen conquering Son, Endless is the vict'ry, thou o'er death hast won.

Lo! Jesus meets us, risen from the tomb; Lovingly he greets us, scatters fear and gloom; let the Church with gladness, hymns of triumph sing; for her Lord now liveth, death hath lost its sting. Chorus.

No more we doubt thee, glorious Prince of life; life is naught without thee; aid us in our strife; make us more than conquerors, through thy deathless love: bring us safe through Jordan to thy home above. Chorus.
